

# BANDMASTERS OF THE NORTHWEST

The Northwest Bandmasters Association, at that time commonly called “The Old-Timers,” was organized in 1953 for the express purpose of honoring those music educators who had earned the respect and admiration of their colleagues for their unique and successful contributions to the music education of the youth of the Northwest.

Each year, one or more educators are chosen by the past honorees to receive the award and join the association. The first four people honored in 1953 were John Stehn, Andy Loney, Wally Hannah, and Captain Arthur Haynes.

By design, this unique organization ran for many years without officers or dues, although several dedicated persons, among them Byron Hoyt, John Stehn, Norm Street, and Verne Wilson, organized the yearly award ceremony and took charge of other necessary details during the early years. No minutes were taken, and no reports made. Finally, sometime during the first 40 years, one officer, a president, was chosen to hold things together. By 1993, despite a noticeable resistance to bureaucracy, a few minor adjustments to the relaxed method of operation were found to be necessary. Northwest Bandmasters Association now sports a set of by-laws and has added a president-elect and an advisory board beginning in 1994. BY-LAWS revised April 27, 2009

In the early spring, our board members meet to screen candidates for induction, this is often followed by a picnic/Board meeting held in the summer to finalize arrangements for the Annual Fall Banquet. Both get-togethers produce a bit of music, and an ample supply of stories shared with one another, band jokes, and historic anecdotes of all kinds. This levity balances the serious intent and major goal of the organization and of the banquet, which is to honor distinguished music educators, of which **256** have been inducted, and to remember and pay tribute to **135** deceased members as of August 26, 2024.
